The Tudors
Why were they called they called 'Terrible Tudors'?

This half term we will be learning about:

- ⇒ The Tudors in History
- ⇒ Religion during the Tudor period
- ⇒ To understand why and how Henry VIII got to marry six times
- ⇒ Rich and poor in Tudor times
- ⇒ To understand how the Tudor period started

Homework.


Your child will receive homework every Friday and must be returned to school by Monday each week. Homework will include:

Maths

This half term we will:

- -Learn to read, write and order numbers to 1,000,000
- -Counting in steps of 10, 100, 1000 for any number up to 1,000,000
- -Round numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 for any number to 1,000,000



You could help your child at home by:

Practice rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

Discuss what real-world things you would count in the 10, 100 and 1000.

English

This half term we will looking at the text Macbeth. Throughout this unit of work the children will:

- -Learn the features of scripts and informational leaflets
- Learn how to write a persuasive letter
- -Learn and hone our use of adverbs
- -Read/write a range of words that include silent 'b's, and words that end in ough, ible, and able



You could help your child at home by:

Reading daily for 30 minutes and practicing the spellings of words with silent 'b's, and words that end in ough, ible and able for 10 minutes a day.

Beginning to look at the Year 5 and 6 spelling list to familiarise your child with words that they aren't familiar with.

Science - Forces

This half term we will:

- -Learn to explain how the force gravity pulls objects towards the earth
- -Identify our five senses and which body part is linked to each.
- -Carry out scientific experiments and understand the process of fair testing

You could help your child at home by:

Experiment with how different household objects move or fall. Ask children to compare similarities and differences between objects.

Computing- Media

This half term we will:

- Collect copyright free images and sounds from online sources
- ⇒ Plan, create and deliver a multimedia presentation to an audience that it has been written for.
- ⇒ Assess their own and each other's presentations, podcasts, graphics or video creations against a set of criteria

You could help your child at home by:

Enhance your child's awareness of the importance of staying safe online. Have children experience different examples of media they may want to use in their work.

RE/SEAL - Worship

This half term we will:

- -Learn what is worship
- -Learn which rituals are common between faiths
- -Understand what role expression plays in worship

You could help your child at home by:

Have students retell their learnings. Ask students to discuss any comparisons they've noticed between different religions. Encourage students to reflect on their beliefs and how they feel about what they've learned.

PE – Dance

This half term we will:

- -Learn to put pieces of choreography together
- -Use partner and group movements to create a dance scene
- -Understand the different areas of a stage

You could help your child at home by:

Encouraging them to practice their learnings with you. Have them practice teaching the choreography. Ask children to demonstrate the different areas of the stage.
