Our Topic

All Creatures Great and Small

This half term we will be learning about:

- ⇒ Farms
- ⇒ The Life Cycle of Butterflies and Frogs
- ⇒ Consolidating our number knowledge to 10
- ⇒ One more and one less
- ⇒ Addition and subtraction
- ⇒ Weights and measures

Homework

On a Monday your child will be set homework via SeeSsw. This must be completed by Thursday each week. If you have any issues with logging in to SeeSaw, please let the class staff know.

If your child completes their homework on time they will receive 2 personal points.

Maths

This half term we will be:

- ⇒ Learning to recognise, order and count amounts up to 10.
- ⇒ Saying which numbers are 1 more and 1 less than a given number.
- ⇒ Adding and subtracting two single digit numbers.
- ⇒ Consolidating our knowledge of shape, space and measures.

<u>You could help your child at home by:</u> counting objects up to 10, using everyday objects to add or subtract, (washed milk bottle tops are perfect for practising this skill), encouraging your child to talk about shape, weights and measures.

English

This half term we will:

- Continue with our Power of Reading in Literacy. By introducing two new texts.
- ⇒ Be reading a range of non-fiction texts to research information for our topics including farms and life cycles.
- Write for a variety of purposes.

<u>You could help your child at home by:</u> reading a number of fiction books, allowing your child to read some simple words and/ or sentences in their bedtime stories and allowing your child to write e.g. shopping lists, diaries etc.!

Understanding the World

This half term we will:

- ⇒ Learn about different environments and compare them (city and countryside)
- ⇒ Learn about different farm animals.
- ⇒ Learn about the life cycle of butterflies, and frogs observe and talk about changes.
- Use technology for a variety of purposes, and recognising the types of technology used in homes and schools etc.

You could help your child at home by: discussing and exploring the local environment, insects and wildlife. Going on walks, looking at nature, especially through the changing season. Discussing technology you have at home and how this might be similar or different to the technology used in other places, such as schools, hospitals etc.
