(The total should be 7 or less) Amber/Red Warm up: With your child, count to 20 together and then see if they can count to 20 on their own. MAIN: This week we will be using quantities and objects, to add two single-digit numbers and count on to find the answer. Children to have objects they can use to count. Amber/Red

Warm up: Children to count to 20.

MAIN: Show a number between 1-10 written on a piece of paper and say we are going to add 4 on. Model counting on 4 on a number line. This can be drawn on a piece of paper. Say a number to your child and ask them to count on a given number on their number line.

Phoneme: or

Green: I see a fork.


Amber: I might see the fork with my

Green:

Warm up: Sing 10 Green Bottles song with song props. Model 1:1 counting of the bottles on the table. Encourage different children to come to the front and count the bottles each time.

MAIN: if you have dice at home use this to roll twice and then add the numbers together, use objects to help visualise the amount.

Alternatively, there are virtual dice if you type it

in the search engine online.

Amber/Red

Warm up: Have the number 1-20 on paper, face down on the floor ask your child to pick a number and then count on from that number to 20.

MAIN: Give your child an amount of objects and you have a different amount. Count them both separately and then ask your child how many we have altogether. This should be repeated a few times.

Practise writing the graphemes in the pre cursive handwriting font.

Words: fur, burt, church

Help your child to read the words by writing them down. They can also segment the sounds they hear and write them as words.

Read the challenge sentences together:

Green: A cat on the mat.

Amber: The church cat is on the mat.

Red: That church cat can curl up on the mat.

Repeat with different numbers.


Amber/Red
