Attendance and Punctuality Update

Attendance and punctuality are essential for maximising learning opportunities, and I would like to draw your attention to some updates regarding our school timings. As a reminder, the school gates open promptly at **8:30am**, and classroom doors close at **8:40am**.

We have noticed more recently that there is an increase in lateness, which is disrupting the learning environment for both latecomers and their peers.

To support with this, starting from Monday a bell will ring at 8:40am daily to signal the closure of classroom doors. It is imperative that children arrive on time to ensure they can start their day promptly and make the most of their learning time.









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Home Alone Pupils

I would like to address the issue of children going home alone, in Key Stage 2. If you have allowed your child to go home unaccompanied, please ensure that a consent form is completed and submitted to the school.

Additionally, it is crucial to have a conversation with your child about safety measures, including what to do if the adult is not present at the agreed meeting point. We have had some instances recently where we have been concerned about the welfare of children, and your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

If we notice that your child is involved in any disruptive behaviour on their way home, unfortunately they will not be allowed to walk home alone and you will be expected to collect them daily.
